VOLUNTEER

Bone Marrow Transplant Training, Accra, Ghana (2018). Invited by the medical director of Cure2Children.org to travel to Accra, Ghana with the purpose of advising and training the nursing staff of the newly developed bone marrow transplant unit at Ridge Greater Accra Regional Hospital. Prior to my arrival, another nurse who specialized in bone marrow transplant had worked with the nurses for four weeks, teaching them about basic skills such as priming intravenous tubing, checking medical orders, drawing up medications for administration, including chemotherapy, and basic concepts of caring for children in clean conditions when they are immunocompromised after transplant. I continued the work of the previous advisor, teaching concepts of thoroughly examining patients, assessing for and treat pain as ordered by the physician. I also provided education into using computers to chart on the patients,

documenting the times medications had been given, exam findings, and activities of daily living and began the development of policies and standards that would be used to guide patient care as well as editing educational materials used in the United States to meet the needs of staff, patients, and their caregivers. Many of these tasks were given to the advisor and trainer that followed me after my visit had ended.
